Academic Definition

- Entrepreneurship is the process of recognizing, or creating an opportunity, testing it in the market, and gathering the resources, necessary to go into business.
 - Any attempt at new business or venture creation, such as self-employment, a new business organization, or the expansion of an existing business by an individual, a team of individuals, or an established business.
 - (Kelly, Singer and Herrington, 2016) (GEM definition)


What is Entrepreneurship?

Academic Definition

Fred Wilson, Venture Capitalist posits that;

• Entrepreneurs assemble and then integrate all the resources needed—the money, the people, the business model, the strategy—needed to transform an invention or an idea into a viable business.




Who is an Entrepreneur?


Main Factors Influencing Entrepreneurial activity
